Or so my former pastor says. Once you have caught the bug, it's impossible to shake it. So look out, because Vacation Bible School is coming to Bellevue Methodist Church this summer. From 6-8 PM on June 23-27, we will be sharing the good news that in a wild world, Jesus is our *True North* with school-age children from our community. So, in addition to the registration information contained elsewhere in the Newsletter, I want to take a moment and share with you 4 qualities that make Vacation Bible School a truly viral event.

- 1) VBS Activates Evangelism. Maybe you don't consider yourself an evangelist. You might feel like you don't even know where to begin when it comes to talking to others about Jesus. Thankfully, Vacation Bible School activates evangelism by empowering everyone involved to take part in sharing the gospel. Whether you are inviting your neighbors or grandkids, showing Christian hospitality at the check-in station, leading an activity, or having spiritual conversations with kids, Vacation Bible School provides anyone who wants grow in the gift of evangelism an opportunity to do so.
- 2) VBS Brings the Bible to Life. In the first VBS I worked as an adult, I had the opportunity to play the character of Daniel in the Bible skits. As I prepared for each group to visit my station, I found that Daniel's experiences recorded in the Bible were speaking to me in new and deeper ways. Vacation Bible School is built on the premise that the Bible isn't merely a book we read but is the living word of God through which he speaks truth to us today. It is a word to be experienced as well as interpreted and applied.
- 3) VBS Kindles Connections. According to a study conducted by the Fuller Youth Institute, young people are significantly more likely to remain connected to the Christian faith if they have meaningful relationships with unrelated adults who love Jesus. But where do those relationships happen? They happen in settings like VBS. I still remember being introduced to two of my very first VBS leaders as a child. Ms. Bonnie and Grandma Rosie had been nearly strangers to me, but after being in their VBS group they became not only familiar faces but frequent encouragers on my spiritual journey.
- 4) VBS Builds Bridges. What is the price tag on a person coming to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior? The truth is that there is nothing more valuable, yet we often wonder how we can present the good news to people in an inviting and compelling way. A dear friend of mine received saving faith as a result of her 9-year old daughter attending Vacation Bible School and bringing what she learned home. Through the ministry of Vacation Bible School, God reached a whole family that had not set foot in a church in decades. And every year we hold VBS, we give him the opportunity to do it again.

So, I hope you will join me in praying for, helping with, and inviting your friends, family, and neighbors to this event. *Because there is no cure for VBS*.






The 4U Free Store has temporarily moved into the basement of the Bellevue Methodist Church. Hours of Operation:
